Hi there! Welcome to the Mississippi Coastal Cleanup Program Seasonal Newsletter.

The Mississippi Coastal Cleanup Program is an educational program that promotes the conservation of our local marine environment by influencing active stewardship within our community. This program is housed at the Mississippi State University's Coastal Research and Extension Center in Biloxi, MS. Check out what we've been up to!

Monthly Cleanups

Our cleanups aren't exclusive to just beaches - we venture into many areas on the coast including waterfront parks and recreational areas! For the March Monthly Cleanup, volunteers spent their Saturday morning picking up trash from Point Park in Pascagoula, removing over **155 pounds of trash**. In April, for the *Earth Day Celebration Cleanup* at the I.G. Levy Memorial Park, volunteers removed **1,396 pieces** of debris. Participants also receive promo cards donated by Lucy's in Biloxi.

In May, 30 volunteers including a group from Center Point Energy took to Pascagoula Beach to remove over 100 pounds of trash consisting mostly of **single-use plastic**.

2022 MONTHLY CLEANUPS

Oh DEER-BRIS!

Despite the uncertain rain forecast, 80 volunteers took part in the 2022 Deer Island Cleanup on Saturday, April 2nd. Volunteers were shuttled to the island via boat where they picked up trash, recycled, removed debris, recorded data, and discarded everything into a dumpster, kindly provided by Waste Management, on the mainland. During the event's brief duration, *1,505 pounds* were removed and ~80 bags of trash were collected.



In efforts to give back to the community and support team building, folks with Biloxi Contact Center of Equity Lifestyle Properties did a cleanup at Hiller Park and at the beach near the Biloxi Lighthouse. In total, they removed over 120 pounds of trash!




