
ANNUAL MS COASTAL CLEANUP EVENT

MSCCP IN THE CLASSROOM

Reducing litter and marine debris starts long before a beach cleanup. While cleanups are important to collect data and the types and possible sources of that debris, the cycle will never end if we do not stop it at its source. A critical step toward this end is education.





MSCCP visits classrooms in
K-12 schools as well as community
organizations to teach students about the
hazards associated with marine debris and
ways to reduce the amount of waste we
produce in our daily lives. Students then
filter water samples for microplastics
and observe them using
a microscope.

INLAND CLEANUPS

The Mississippi Inland Cleanup Program, in partnership with SWAPS (Sustainability with Awareness and Prevention Solutions), has been bringing prevention and removal strategies to schoolaged children in Coastal Mississippi counties. So far this year, 84 volunteers in Jackson and Harrison Counties have collected 145.02 lbs. of litter.

Marine debris is any solid, man-made material that is intentionally or unintentionally disposed of or abandoned into the marine environment and is an increasingly dangerous pollution issue we are facing both locally & globally.

REQUEST A BIN INITIATIVE

Can't make it to one of our scheduled events? The MSCCP can provide groups with guidance and all the supplies they need to perform their very own cleanup. Our only requirement - volunteers <u>MUST</u> collect data! We do this at each of our cleanup events and we want to know how much and what types of trash you are picking up. Supplies provided include gloves, trash bags, trash grabbers, buckets, a first aid kit, hand sanitizer, hanging scale to collect weight, and data collection materials.

So far in 2024, **367 Request a Bin volunteers** have collected over **1,300 lbs. of litter** in Hancock, Harrison, and Jackson Counties.
