The Mississippi Coastal Cleanup Program (MSCCP) is an educational program that promotes the conservation of our local marine environment by influencing active stewardship within our community. This program is housed at the Mississippi State University's Coastal Research and Extension Center in Biloxi, MS.

Check out what we've been up to!

MARDI GRAS CLEANUP KREWE

This year, we tried something new and teamed up with Oceanic Global and Corona USA for a post-parade Mardi Gras Cleanup. Thanks to 108 volunteers, we made a huge impact-- collecting 461.98 lbs of trash, with 255.28 lbs of just beads!

Thanks to Osprey initiative, we were able to divert 80.02 lbs of usable beads from the landfill to be cleaned and reused next year!









SMALL GROUP CLEANUPS

This year, we have coordinated several small-scale cleanups with community partners, including the Harrison County 4-H Home School Club and Boardwalk Pipelines Gulf South Region. Through these efforts, 29 volunteers have removed 202.97 lbs of litter from Harrison County Beaches.

Can't make it to one of our scheduled events? The MSCCP can provide groups with guidance and all the supplies they need to perform their very own cleanup. Our only requirement - volunteers must collect data! We do this at each of our cleanup events and we want to know how much and what types of trash you are picking up. Supplies provided include gloves, trash bags, trash grabbers, buckets, a first aid kit, hand sanitizer, hanging scale, and data collection materials. So far in 2025, 146 Request a Bin volunteers have collected 493.55 lbs. of litter in Hancock, Harrison, and Jackson Counties.








